#### **Rocky Mountain Region NMRA Awards**

The Rocky Mountain Region presents a special award for the top 3 highest NMRA judged scores, limited to the **Motive Power**, **Rolling Stock and Structures** categories. These top three awards are presented in addition to any other award presented, e.g., 1<sup>st</sup> Place Motive Power, 1<sup>st</sup> Place Online Structures, etc. The top three **RMR 1<sup>st</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup> Place** awards are the: **The Summit, Duane Miller, and Fred Carlson Awards**, respectively.



The "Summit" award is symbolic for a Region named for the Rocky Mountains, for the individual who has achieved the peak of the Region's modelers, the "Summit". Our second place award honors Duane Miller, longtime Caboose Hobbies owner who supported the Region for decades. Sadly, we lost Duane this summer, please catch my tribute to Duane and the Miller family on our RMR Home page. Our 3<sup>rd</sup> place award honors our late President Fred Carlson, who set many standards in modeling in our Region.

In contrast, the National Contest selects one entry from all the  $1^{st}$  place categories, awards that entry the "Gold Award", and then removes it from its category, which then results moving up the remaining entries from that category one notch (from  $2^{nd}$  to  $4^{th}$  to  $1^{st}$  to  $3^{rd}$ ). The Region does not remove the top entry from it's category and elevate  $2^{nd} - 4^{th}$  place entries to  $1^{st} - 3^{rd}$ .

### **Rocky Mountain Region vs National Categories**

National also has two categories for each main category, scratch-built and kit-built. The RMR does not differentiate scratch-built vs kit-built, but includes all models to whatever degree of scratch to specific categories. It is noteworthy that scratch-built and partially scratch-built models regularly earn more points than kit-built models in either the National or the Region contests. In fact, the National contest rarely has any kit-built entries earning a merit award over the past several contests. The explanation for this is simple. NMRA judging is based on the amount of work a modeler does on their entry. Planning, design, drawings, research, and the making of parts generally are not a part of kit-built parts, but it is a significant portion of scoring.

As opposed to the National's single Structures category, the RMR has featured two Structures categories, Online and Offline (normally what is considered a building). According to NMRA rules, "just about anything on the layout that was man made and doesn't fit into one of the other Master Builder categories". In the past, this would include track as well, however, now track judging has been reduced to a simple a pass/fail and so now is excluded.

The RMR has added a third Structures category called "Extras". Extras include rolling stock loads (car excluded), vehicles, ships, derricks, towers, docks, cranes, etc. Note that these types of structures would

require a lot of work to achieve a merit award, if at all possible. Models submitted for judging should be expected to be highly detailed, mostly scratchbuilt, and very complex to earn enough points for a merit award.

#### **Rocky Mountain Region Judged Entries**

Modelers have the option to have their model participate in NMRA judging or not. NMRA judging requires contest forms 901 and 902 to be submitted with the entry. For the contest, the things that help judges the most:

Construction details, construction photos with simple captions – keep informative & concise Details: A list of all Commercial, kit-supplied, and scratch made details


Prototype: Photos, documentation, what research you did, of prototype or what free-lance it is based on.

Scratchbuilt – Don't just say all scratchbuilt, describe complexity, materials, special techniques, casting, photo-etching, etc.

Assume judges are unfamiliar with your prototype, special construction, details of model. Add description of any out of ordinary, peculiarities, especially noting <u>complexity</u>.

Keep in mind that not every model has the difficulty and complexity to earn enough points for a merit award. Simple models may be of high quality, but will be limited in total points for their lack of complexity.

### **2025 Convention Special: Hold the Bus!**



This year's Convention Special will be <u>anything that could possibly represent a "Bus"</u>. I wanted to get back to the original concept for the Convention Special, something simple, something unique, and something that would hardly qualify for a merit award! But maybe it is another of those little observed projects that may have been made with a lot of effort, an interesting back story, or just something neat! This can be a city bus, school bus, converted van, motor-bus or other conversion. This can also be a fictitious or prototype diorama. This is meant to be a fun category and is won by popular vote.

### **Colorado Award**

Every convention features a popular award that best represents model railroading of that particular state. This can be anything, from a piece of rolling stock, locomotive, structure, diorama, or anything that represents railroading of Colorado. The award for the Best Representation of Colorado Railroading is not a judged category and is awarded by popular vote, although judging may be requested for the model as appropriate. The model may be displayed as a model only or include a diorama.

## **NMRA Judged & Popular Vote Categories**

Categories	Definition
MOTIVE POWER	Powered, self-propelled locomotive (Dummys excluded)
Steam Locomotive	Any locomotive receiving propulsion from the expansion of steam.
Diesel & Other Locomotive	Any locomotive receiving propulsion from an internal combustion engine, including self-propelled maintenance vehicles. Any AB pair or ABB multi-unit diesels shall be judged as a single model.
Traction	Any locomotive or car receiving propulsion from an external source of electricity.
ROLLING STOCK	Anything that runs on rails and is NOT self-propelled, including Dummy locomotives
Passenger Car	Any car in a passenger train, including head end express cars, non-powered trolleys and interurbans.
Freight Car	Any car used to transport revenue.
Caboose	Any car used on the rear of the train utilized by the train crew.
Non-revenue	Any car used for the purpose of maintaining the right-of-way and associated structures.
Dummy Loco	Any unpowered unit not paired with a powered unit
STRUCTURES On-line	Any class of building serviced by the railroad (requires track access).
Off-line	Any class of building not necessarily requiring track access (Commercial, industrial, residential).
Extra	Miscellaneous structures other than buildings: bridges, rolling stock loads (car excluded), vehicles, ships, derricks, towers, docks, cranes, etc.
MODULE	Any display of models including scenery, to be judged as "SCENERY"
Module	Modules are excluded from 1 <sup>st</sup> -3 <sup>rd</sup> Place RMR Grand Prize awards Portion of any modular layout on display during the contest
Diorama	Any other larger size of module
Mini-Diorama	Any module of 144 sq inches or less
T-TRAK Module	Approximately square foot KATO standard T-TRAK module
