

TORTOISETM REPAIR at THE DENVER HO CLUB

A typical model railroad thing happened some time ago. I installed the last of several TortoiseTM switch machines in the Cripple Creek area of The Denver HO Model Railroad Club layout. These were replacing twin coil switch machines that had been in place for more than 40 years. I confirmed the operation of the TortoiseTM machines and the new control panel. A couple weeks went by and I was there again, installing dwarf signals to indicate the alignment of the switches. A track power short circuit would come and go as I changed one switch from normal to reverse. It worked only a couple weeks before, but now something was amiss! After a bit of trouble shooting, I determined that the suspect switch machine had internal problems. The machine was removed for a trip to my home workshop.


The TortoiseTM switch machine was older, but appeared OK externally and had initially worked fine. No worry about warranty, the old machine was quickly opened. Figure 1 reveals the five screw holes hidden by the label. The holes can be found by rubbing a finger over the label. I cut the label away using a sharp #11 blade. The screws are Phillips head type, a number 1 driver fits fine.






Separate the two parts of the case carefully so small parts do not fall out and run away to hide under the furniture. Figure 2 shows the parts that make up the gear train. Notice, in case some do fall out, that the three small gears are all installed with the large gear toward the printed circuit card.

Figure 3 reveals the problem with this particular TortoiseTM machine. The contacts are attached to the geared lever arm with 'hot upset' rivets. The pins molded into the thermo-plastic part are heated and reformed to act like a rivet. In the case of this machine, the 'hot upset' job was done to extreme, leaving a very thin bit of plastic to hold the phosphor bronze contact material. The thin plastic failed, letting the contact twist and short the frog circuit.






I determined the size of the holes in the contacts using drill bits. A number 56 drill fit the holes and cleared a 00-90 screw. I used the remaining stub of the 'hot upset' pins to locate the centers for drilling 00-90 tap size holes with a number 68 drill. Figure 4 shows drilling the holes that are then carefully tapped 00-90 using a tap held in a pin vise. Do this carefully; some finesse is necessary with these small screws.

Re-attach the contacts using 00-90 screws, being careful not to tighten them too tightly. Figure 5 shows the contacts in place on the geared lever arm.

Re-assembly the gear train, assuring that the contact is located properly as seen in figure 6. I quite sparingly applied plastic compatible lubrication to the shafts of the several gears. I also applied a very thin, wiped on coating of petrolatum (petroleum jelly) to the surface of the printed circuit card where the moving contacts run. This bit of contact lubrication is consistent with the practice of the IBM company years ago on the Standard Modular System printed circuit cards used in mainframe and I/O equipment up to and including some components of System 360.






Figure 7 shows the TortoiseTM ready to go, with the color coded wire pigtail installed. I like the color coded pigtail wire because I typically attach the wires to a terminal block under the layout and the color code eliminates tracing wires. I know that *BROWN* goes to 1, *RED* to 2, *ORANGE* to 3 and so on. The only significant current is in the frog circuit, and the short lengths of small wire will not cause a problem there.
