Steam Over Cumbres

2006 C&TS Steam Freight Special and Convention Chama, NM Friday through Sunday, June 9, 10, and 11, 2006

The Rocky Mountain Region is hosting it's 2006 convention in Chama, New Mexico. The emphasis is on a NARROW GAUGE STEAM FREIGHT – FROM CHAMA, OVER CUMBRES PASS, ALONG TOLTEC GORGE, TO BIG HORN WYE, AND RETURN.

In addition to the all day Saturday train trip, activities include yard and shop tours, welcoming get together on Friday night with a guest speaker from the C&TS RR, NMRA contest, RMR board meeting, and an extra fare Sunday morning breakfast.

The Saturday train trip will be a mixed freight run on an 89 mile round trip. There will be several organized photo run-bys. Lunch and snacks are included. Bring lots of film as there is lots of scenery as well as rail operations. **Want a caboose ride?** A drawing will be held among the first registrants for caboose passes. Here is a chance to ride part of the trip in style. (You must be over 18 years old for this.)

Our headquarters will be the Branding Iron Motel. They have offered us a rate of \$71.10 + tax for a single, \$80.10 + tax for a double and \$8 for each additional person. Mainlines to Cheyenne – 2005 Convention Wrap Up By: Bob Sherwood

June 23-26 saw 54 rails, 11 non-rail, 3 youth and 3 non-NMRA members converging on Cheyenne for the 2005 RMR-NMRA convention.

In addition, nine vendors made the trip to Cheyenne. Among these were Intermountain Railway Co, Yester Year Models, Jones Custom Train Cases, Don Meeker, Wolf Designs, Challenger Press / UP Historical Society, TrainMaster of Denver, AJ Wolff, Wild West Scale Model Builders, Caboose Hobbies and LaBelle Woodworking.

Four modular layouts were on display at this year's convention. There was a father and son N-scale layout, two HO-scale layouts and an LGB layout.

Three prototype tours took place on Friday. 39 people took advantage of the Tour to the Union Pacific Railroad's steam shops and heritage equipment. 14 went to tour the refinery of Frontier Oil. 16 went to tour the facility of Granite Quarry. All of these tours were well received. (I enjoyed two of the three. Well done. Ed.)

Clinics were presented on both Friday and Saturday with most being done twice. The subjects ranged from DCC Installation, to Model Photography, to discussing Prototype Methods. I would like to take this opportunity to thank those members of the Northern Colorado Model Railroad Club for volunteering to present clinics.

Saturday evening found 83 attendees at the Terry Bison Ranch for a three meat Western BBQ with all the trimmings. The guest speaker was Mr. Frank Angstead, President & CEO of Intermountain Railway Company. He talked about how model companies get started and progress.

Out of several of the evening's highlights, the one that stands out the most to me is when Frank presented a coupon for a free "car of choice" to each of the banquet's attendees. This is the first time I can recall this happening at a convention.

Sunday morning found us at a Hobo Breakfast. The buffet provided a good solid meal for those taking advantage of it.

All in all, this was a very successful convention.
