CONFESSIONS OF A HOSTLER BY RICH FLAMMINI, MEMBERSHIP CHAIR

As the Membership Chair for the Region, I enjoy the opportunity to promote the NMRA with all its benefits, including participation in Region and Division activities. Some people might look upon it as hustling membership. It's also good to get to know people and hear about how model railroading fits in their busy lives.

It's always a surprise to meet people from outside the Region when I am at shows. Case in point, my first sign-up this past February at the *Rails in the Rockies* show in Estes Park was from San Jose, California. Now why would a model railroader from the West Coast come all that way for the show? Well I apologize to Bob Trump and the folks from the Estes Valley Division who put on an excellent show, but I think Rocky Mountain National Park might have been a greater influence.

I'm always happy to help other Regions and the Douglas, Wyoming *Railroad Days* show provided another opportunity. Bill Tulley invited me to participate and I had the chance to visit with a fellow from central South Dakota. His pictures showed that he was really proud of his layout but very unhappy with the NMRA. He felt he was deserving of MMR status but couldn't get anyone out to his remote location to judge his work. You might have read about Morrie in an edition of Scale Rails (NMRA ,magazine) last year when the folks from the Mid-Continent Region stepped up due to the information I passed along and got Morrie's work judged. Fortunately he became an MMR shortly before he died. His wife related it was one of the proudest moments of his life.

At a show down in Colorado Springs, I talked to a young man stationed at Fort Carson. He

loved model railroading but his occupation didn't give him much of an opportunity to build a layout. He was reluctant to sign up as he was expecting a deployment to Afghanistan in a few months. Attending a few meetings of the Pikes Peak Division and getting Scale Rails magazine wherever he was stationed convinced him that he should join the NMRA. Hopefully wherever he is stationed stateside when his deployment is completed, a local Division will welcome him.

At a *Great Train Expo* show a couple of years ago in Denver, a gentleman and his daughter passed by. I engaged him in conversation and learned that he lived in the same community as I do. Turns out he was working on a layout and was open to learning about the new materials and

technology. I invited Ernie to sign up and to come to our next Sunrise Division meeting. AL HOVEY Albuquerque, NM Division #6 Rio Grande

I'm responding to your "Help Wanted Call for Candidates" column per the February 2011 "Callboard." I would like to submit my name as a candidate



for election to the RMR Board of Directors. I am a current NMRA, RMR and Rio Grande Division #6 member #136609 00 and joined 09/14/06.

During my membership, I have served as Division #6 secretary two terms, worked on the advertising and promotion committee for "Rails Along the Rio Grande 2008" convention, spearheaded the project railroad with the Boy Scouts and public for the RARG 2008 convention, served as program chairman for Division #6 for 3+ years and am convention chair for the "Rails Along the Rio Grande 2013" convention to be held in Albuquerque June 6-9, 2013.

Personally, I am building the "Fremont and Mo Valley RR" in a 9'X16' room in our two car garage. After the "cowboy line" was abandoned, Fremont, NE was pretty much at the west end of the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad. Fremont served as an interchange point with the Union Pacific Rail Road and the Fremont to Missouri Valley single track stretch served as a bypass of Omaha, NE. Each year I do an open house for the public on the first Sunday afternoon in October.

Prior to joining the NMRA I had never gotten past the plywood, cork and track stage of model railroading.

Since joining the NMRA, I have been blessed with

the friendship of wonderful people who just happen to be great model railroaders and who have been willing to share their expertise and in many cases join me to work on my model railroad. I have adopted a goal of excellence in model railroading and I acknowledge that I have a long list of contributors and friends. I don't think it gets any better than that.

My philosophy is that if you want to receive the benefits from an organization you must also "step up to the plate" and give to the organization. Stepping up and volunteering to be the Division # 6 program chairman, convention chair for RARG 2013 and serve on the RMR Board of Directors is my way of saying thank you while doing something that I enjoy.

RICHARD L (DICK) HUNTER Aurora, CO Division #2 Sunrise



I have been a member of the NMRA and RMR since 1977. Over the years, I have served in many

elected official capacities including: Sunrise Division Superintendent, Region Treasurer, Secretary, President and Director. When I was the RMR President, I also served as a Trustee to the NMRA Board. I have been Contest Chairman, Callboard Editor (several times) and Membership Chairman (several times).

In 1979, I formed the Sunrise Division. I have helped form several other divisions around the Region.

In 1977, I loaded busses for the NMRA National Convention in Denver. For the 1991 convention, I served as vice chairman plus other duties. This convention brought about \$58,000 to the RMR. I was the head guide for the 1977 Post Convention Tour and organized the 1991 Post Convention Tour which brought another \$9,000 into our bank accounts.

I have chaired several Region conventions and worked on many others. I was a committee of one to put together the 1994 convention and freight special on the C&TS and for the 2006 convention in Chama, which included a day on the train. I have attended almost every RMR convention since joining in 1977.

I have handled about 15 model railroad estates for our members, netting up to \$28,000 for the family. In this, I used swap meets, direct sales, live and silent auctions, mail order and E-Bay. I was the first to put computer recording into our auctions. ctd... I am stickler for observing the official documents of the RMR (Constitution, By-Laws, Financial Policy and Convention Guidelines). I bring knowledge of good management practices from my years of teaching management, working and consulting in business, and from self employment work.

ROBERT (BOB) LEMASTER II Salt Lake City, UT Division #15 Wasatch

I do not know if I am really what is wanted but here goes.

I do not really know when I started in model railroading but

it must have been about age six. My father bought a 4 X 8 HO circle layout with two switches and a badly laid siding. Along with the layout came an American Flyer Hudson and a few cars. Father went into model airplanes and I got to keep the layout! That layout was about all I had until I got to high school and got a part time job. I was lucky to have a couple of buddies with layouts and we swapped equipment. One of the guys was my best man and I was his, in spite of this we still keep in touch with each other.

I joined NMRA while in high school and still have some items from the silver anniversary.

Next came college and the only magazine I kept was Model Railroader and sometimes Model Trains and Craftsman too. After graduation in Printing Management came a letter with "greetings" from the President, then came marriage and three kids. Model Railroader still kept coming and then a feeble attempt at a layout. By now the layout was in N-scale and the wife and kids "helped." We never did build anything like a well running layout but the family had fun.

When the son was ten Santa left a Bachmann Gscale radio control, battery powered starter set. Unfortunately the son took up model airplanes with his granddad, but fortunately one of the two daughters was interested in Model Railroading with dad. All three kids worked with dad on the White Water Valley Railroad in Connersville, Indiana, running a little bigger train with a gauge of 4 feet 8 1/2 inches.

To shorten the story one kid at a time moved west from Indiana. The oldest child lives in Colorado Springs, CO. and the other two in the greater Salt Lake City area. About six years ago grandmother said "grand kids in Utah--grand mother in Utah" and that is how we got to Utah. We now had a house on a lot big enough for a garden railway outside and N-scale layout inside. In storage is the Hudson and some other old equipment along with a collection of Model Rail roader magazines.

I wish I could not say I am active in the NMRA's Wasatch Division 15 but I am hoping with a new Division Supervisor that things will improve as they can't get much worse.

While all of the other parts of living were occurring I put in 18 years in the US Coast Guard Auxiliary and am proud to say I twice commanded a flotilla. I think the Auxiliary has been an excellent training ground for work with any volunteer organization especially one with members spread over a large area and money spent on the hobby varying from very little to a lot, along with diverse interests within the hobby.

I was affected with the model railroad disease Christmas 1947 when I received a previously owned Lionel train set. Every Christmas after that



date until 1957 had something from Lionel under the tree. Christmas 1958 brought an HO train set and a subscription to MR, which started the model railroadbuilding phase. This phase of the disease has progressed geometrically to the present. Of course, there have been lapses caused by minor irritations such as high school, collage, military service, graduate school and an attempt to earn some money working in the high arctic as a senior construction engineer.

Until the early 1990's, I was a lone wolf modeler dabbling in what ever caught my interest. This situation was the result of never being in the same location for more than two to three years. Then I made the mistake of joining the Burlington Route Historical Society. Now my interests are concentrated on that railroad. There are of course occasional lapses when a book is published on some new to me interesting railroad.

When I came back to Wyoming from the high arctic, I became interested in the history of three minor railroads in northeastern Wyoming: the Wyoming Railway – Clearmont to Buffalo, the North and South Railroad – Casper to Midwest and the Wyoming and Northwestern Railway – Casper to Lander. There is just enough information out there to pique your interest, but never enough to answer most of the questions.

In 1998 I joined the Northern Wyoming Division – Rocky Mountain Region – NMRA. I have served as the division secretary, division contest judge and division superintendent for that organization. At present, I am serving as contest chairman and am on the board of directors for the Rocky Mountain region.

To date, I have earned the following achievement certificates towards the Master Model Railroader certificate. Association Volunteer, Association Official, Model Railroad Engineer – Electrical, Master Builder – Structures, Master Builder – Cars, Model Railroad Author.

In summary, I have been interested in railroads, modeling and railroad history for most of the sixtyseven years that I have been on this planet.


Therefore, if elected, I would be pleased to serve on the RMR board of directors for a second two year term.



Models entered for AP Judging are not identified until after the Popular Vote has concluded. Even the builder is not identified unless that individual chooses to do so. The main reason for a modeler to identify their work would be to allow other modelers to find that person and discuss modeling techniques with the builder. This would not be a bad idea if someone would like to try it.

A Mini Diorama is any modeled scene mounted on a base that has a footprint equal to or less than a specified area (144 sq-in). The requirements for the mini diorama are very simple.

THE DIORAMA MAY BE ON ANY SUBJECT THAT THE MODELER MAY CHOOSE.

A railroad related subject is preferred but a subject representing the theme of the current convention would be also be acceptable, although not required.

THE AREA COVERED BY THE DIORAMA CAN NOT BE LARGER THAN 144 SQUARE INCHES.

There is no restriction for length or width as long as these two dimensions when multiplied together equal 144 or less. There is also no restriction on the shape of this area. Square, rectangle, circle, kidney bean, etc. are all acceptable. As an extreme example: a diorama that is 1 inch wide and 144 inches long would qualify.

THERE IS NO RESTRICTION ON EITHER HEIGHT OR DEPTH.

Those two dimensions are dependent on what the modeler can transport.

THAT IS IT! There are no other requirements.

HOW DOES THE RMR MODEL CONTEST WORK



BY POPULAR VOTE: First, second and third place certificates are presented in each category in which a model is entered. Placement is determined by the number of popular votes each model receives.

BY AP JUDGING: The Caboose Hobbies award is presented to the modeler with the highest over all AP score. The Mizell Hobbies award goes to the modeler with the second highest over all AP score.

ADDITIONAL AWARDS may be presented, if available. Requirements will be determined by the sponsoring convention.



I hope that the members of your organization will consider attending and participating in the "Rails Along the Rio Grande 2013". Mark your schedule now!




