## Cheyenne Depot Museum

A National Historic Landmark, the station was the railroad's largest facility west of Council Bluffs, Iowa, and a major western example of Richardsonian Romanesque architecture.

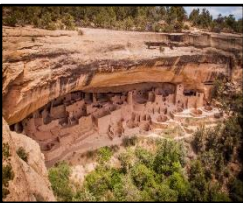
Visit the Colorado Railroad Museum and stroll the Museum’s 15-acre railyard with over 100 locomotives, passenger and freight cars, cabooses and even a G-scale garden railway. Watch as Colorado railroad history is brought back to life in our Roundhouse restoration facility with a working, hand-operated turntable. ### **Colorado Model Railroad Museum**

The Colorado Model Railroad Museum is one of the finest miniature accomplishments in the world. This 5,500 sq. ft masterpiece required over five years and 280,000 volunteer hours to complete. This one-of-a-kind museum has hundreds of railroad scenes, more than 500 scale locomotives, 80 scale miles of track, thousands of other handmade artifacts including around 28,000 handmade trees. ### **Mesa Verde National Park (970) 529-4465**

Mesa Verde National Park is in southwest Colorado. It’s known for its well-preserved Ancestral Puebloan cliff dwellings, notably the huge Cliff Palace. The Chapin Mesa Archeological Museum has exhibits on the ancient Native American culture. Mesa Top Loop Road winds past archaeological sites and overlooks, including Sun Point Overlook with panoramic canyon views. Petroglyph Point Trail has several rock carvings.
